ABOUT RENÉE CROWN

Renée Schine Crown is among Syracuse University's most esteemed alumnae. She graduated from Syracuse University with a B.A. in fine arts in 1950. She and her husband, Lester Crown, moved to Chicago shortly after graduation and began lives of exemplary public service and civic engagement. The major funding for the Honors Program came from her gift in honor of her parents, Hildegard and J. Meyer Schine. She has worked on behalf of the University, serving the Board of Trustees on its Executive Committee and University Relations Committee, and on the College of Arts and Sciences Dean's Advisory Board. She played a major role in the University's "Campaign for Syracuse" and "Commitment to Learning" campaign in the 1980s and 1990s.

For this work and for her continuing commitment to Syracuse University, she has received the College of Arts and Sciences Distinguished Alumnae Award, the George Arent's Pioneer Medal, and the Chancellor's Medal for Outstanding Achievement. In 1984, she received an honorary doctorate from Syracuse University.

Orlin Prize

ABOUT THE ORLIN PRIZE

Each year, members of the Honors Core Faculty lead committees to select the best Thesis of the year in five categories: humanities, social sciences, natural sciences/engineering, professional, and creative projects. Honorable mention recipients receive a reward of \$500 and prize recipients receive an award of \$1,000. From among those prize-winning Theses, one is selected to receive the Orlin Prize for the "outstanding Thesis of the year." This honor carries an additional \$2,000 award.

ABOUT DAVID ORLIN '47

The Orlin Prize is made possible by a gift from Honors alumnus David Orlin. Mr. Orlin graduated from Syracuse University in 1947 with a BA in Political Science from the College of Arts and Sciences, and went on to pursue a successful law practice in New York City. He served as chief counsel and partner at Windels Marx Lane & Mittendorf, LLP, from 1954 until his passing in 2015. His areas of practice included corporate, securities, antitrust and trade regulation, and trademark law. Mr. Orlin's wide-ranging career included advising foreign companies in connection with mergers, acquisitions and divestitures, and securities registration.

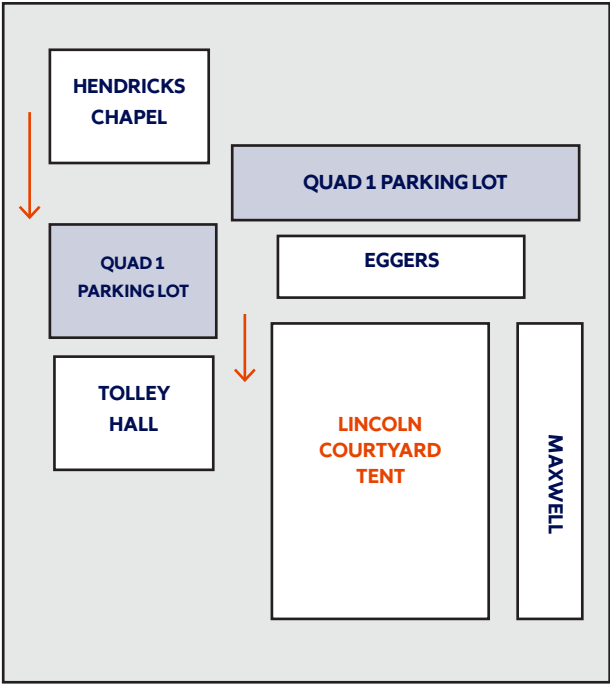
